### **CHROMEBOOKS**



## LIBRARY AWARDED GRANT FOR LARGE PRINT BOOKS

When I first decided to apply for a grant for Large Print books, I was excited for our students whose vision prevents them from easily reading standard print books. We had a shelf of Large Print book when I arrived in 1991, but these titles were old and outdated. In September, the WMS library received 28 Large Print books, valued around \$400 from the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

Our two identified vision-impaired students were thrilled. Reading for these two girls just became less of a strain and more enjoyable.

The LP collection included a number of titles we didn't currently have plus many beloved titles that are always in demand. I decided to create a display with the new LP books. These titles began flying off the shelves. Regular-sighted students were benefiting from these books, too. Why? Research shows the LP books help all readers feel more successful as they improve their reading speed and comprehension. Readers report the words "seem easier in a larger font" and they feel satisfaction from turning the pages at a faster pace. Come take a look for yourself!

In increasing numbers, WMS students are reading eBooks or listening to Audiobooks from the Timberland Regional Library!

# BOOK TRAILERS COMING YOUR WAY

For the second year in a row, Mr. Covner's video production classes have paired with Mrs. Mathis to create book trailers on books from the WMS Library.
